- Activities are broken down into core and supplemental deliverables
- Upcoming projects
 - o Identification of areas for stream clean-up; clean-up work itself was not a deliverable
 - Video for the City of Lorain on restoration
 - AOC workshop for invasive species

Lorain County Project Updates

- Invasive Species Workshop
 - December 9 and 10; attendees choose one day
 - Classroom and field training
 - o Information was emailed to Advisory Committee prior to completion of minutes
- Willow Creek Stream Restoration
 - \$600,000 grant from the US EPA for restoration in Willow Creek to work on some of the project identified by EnviroScience
 - Received approximately 5 proposals; selected Coldwater Consulting's proposal to bring to the board for approvals
- Invasive Species Removal
 - o Fieldwork for the first phase is completed; in process of finalizing report for NOAA
 - o Phases 2 and 3 are in progress concurrently; 30 acres for Phase 2 and 30 acres for Phase 3

- Healing Our Waters Conference
 - Kate Hoffmann, Lyn Ickes, and Kristen Risch presented at the conference in Chicago
 - Gave an update on what is going on with the Black River watershed; well-received presentation
- Website Migration
 - o In process of migrating http://blackriverwatershed.org/ to the county's website; should be completed in early January
 - Advisory Committee members are encouraged to like the Black River Watershed's Facebook page: https://www.facebook.com/blackriverwatershed

City of Lorain Project Updates

- Rookery and Black River Landing
 - Money awarded by NOAA last year
 - Restoration and installation of fish shelves at the remainder of the heron rookery; fish shelves are installed and currently working on bank stabilization
 - At Black River Landing, focus was on removal of invasives, bank regrading, and installation of erosion protection; this work is completed
- Near Shore Revegetation Project
 - Request made for \$88,000 to plant willow trees in areas that are semi-submerged
 - No formal bidding process due to low cost of project; went with Radix Landscaping who was able to plant more trees for the money and was approved by the board on November 16
 - Planting 5,000 willow trees between now and the end of March 2016
- Lakeview Beach
 - Received green infrastructure grant
 - Conducted testing on the stormwater outfall on the west side to see if it had an effect on bacterial advisories
 - o All sampling completed but results weren't as expected
 - No dry weather bacteria problem from the outfall
 - Wet weather samples had high bacteria levels throughout the duration of the storm

- o Project for installation of a passive stormwater treatment system is currently on hold
- Information shared by William Gollnitz from the City of Lorain WWTP on fluorescence;
 Advisory Committee discussed the use of fluorescence to determine the type of bacteria in the water; could possibly take samples and test them to trace back to where the bacteria are added
- Black River Restoration and Remediation Program
 - Awarded \$15.095 million in August; largest GLRI grant ever awarded
 - o Quality assurance plans submitted and received preliminary comments on one of them
 - o Drum disposal in assessment portion of remediation
 - Moving overburden from one location to another to see what is underground; assessment slated to begin in December but is weather dependent
 - Hoping for design and construction in March 2016
 - Met with Ohio EPA division administrators in Columbus about project; will have groups at regional and state level to help with project management

Lakeview Beach BARK Project Results

- Ohio EPA gave Metro Parks a grant to implement a gull control program aimed to reduce the gull
 population and improve water quality. Ohio Geese Control was hired to use their trained border
 collies to assist with this project.
- 10% reduction in positive results for E. coli from summer 2014 to summer 2015 despite a very rainy summer (58% in 2015 vs. 68% in 2014)
- Also found that the bacterial levels were not as high
- This has been a positive program and will be continued with in-house dog or rehiring the company used this year

Old Business

Guidance Document

- Ted Conlin did not receive comments on the guidance document
- Unsure if Don Romancak will receive a letter from EPA soon about the adoption of the guidance document

Use of Sediments from Dredging

- Impending moratorium on open lake dumping
- Kate Hoffmann was contacted by the EPA Director's Office about a list of potential projects to utilize dredge sediments
- Concern is the contamination of sediments with Phragmites

BUI Removal

- Feds reviewed algae and eutrophication BUI Removal document and had a few comments
- Did not view the fish consumption BUI Removal document favorably and suggested odd and cosmetic changes
- Call was held with GLNPO about fish consumption documents

- Will send both documents when they are ready
- Will need a public meeting and public comments

New Business

City of Lorain Update

- Working with Metro Parks to stencil on the catch basins to alert people that they go to the river and lake
- Outreach requirements for 2016
 - Possibility of the county working together on an instructional video for homeowner associations about Phragmites
 - o Include information on post-construction requirements and basin management

Tour of the Black River AOC

- Ted Conlin was recently given the Cuyahoga AOC
- Cuyahoga AOC wants to set up a tour of the Black River AOC and bring a bus of people to view it

French Creek Projects

- Unsure of progress on projects
- Projects should be going through Ohio EPA but going through US EPA
- Issue with fish toxicity

- Grant will be awarded for the purposes of improving water quality, coastal planning, education programs, land acquisition, research, improving public access, habitat restoration, and innovative projects
